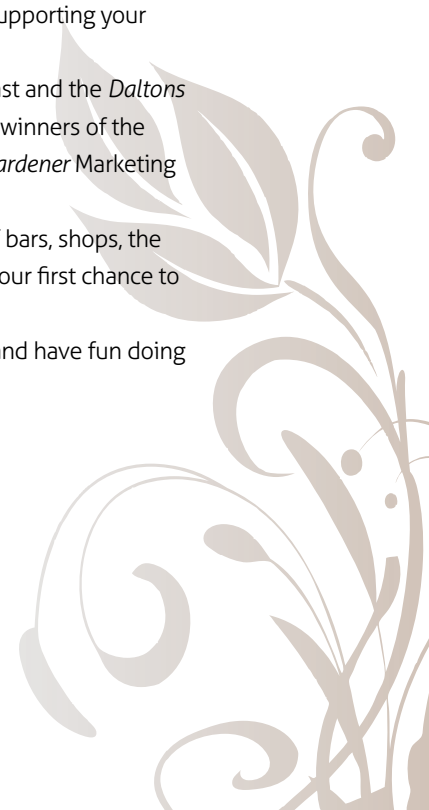

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# SPEAKER PROFILES

## Sir Gil Simpson KNZM, QSM, D.Sc (honoris causa)

CEO Jolly Good Software

Sir Gil was born in Christchurch, New Zealand in 1948 and at age 18 began his career as a computer programmer. In 1969 he wrote the initial direct debit and direct credit applications which are in common use throughout the New Zealand banking industry today, and by age 22 he was Head of Computer Programming at the Comalco aluminum smelter in Bluff, which at that time was the largest industrial project ever undertaken in New Zealand.

He lived in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, working as a programmer for Caterpillar Inc. between 1976 and 1978, after which he returned to New Zealand to develop a new concept in computer programming through his creation of the fourth generation language known as LINC. Distributed by Unisys Corporation, LINC was adopted by more than 4,000 organisations globally, generating billions of dollars in revenue. It is still sold today and remains New Zealand's most successful software export to date.

Sir Gil has resided in Christchurch for the past 30 years. He is the founder both of the Aoraki Corporation, developers of the LINC and Jade programming languages, and Jade Software Corporation. Sir Gil was also instrumental in the creation of Christchurch's Technology Park, where there is now a street named after him, Sir Gil Simpson Drive. His latest venture is Jolly Good Software Pty Ltd, which he launched in 2006 and manages from the Jolly Good Software Gallery in Christchurch.

Sir Gil is recognised around the world as an advisor and speaker on Information Technology, particularly in relation to business. With many outstanding achievements his profile in Information Technology has accorded him a number of accolades and positions. In 2000 Sir Gil was chosen to receive the New Zealand Computer Society's Supreme Award for the most outstanding contribution to computing in New Zealand in the 20th century. That same year he was made a Knight Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit for services to the computer industry and the broader community, and in 2003 he received an honorary doctorate in science from the University of Canterbury. Sir Gil was inaugurated into the New Zealand Business Hall of Fame in 2005, an honour reserved for business leaders responsible for outstanding contributions to the nation. In 2008 Sir Gil received an NZX Flying Kiwi Award and joined the PricewaterhouseCoopers NZ Hi-Tech Hall of Fame.

Helen Mahon-Stroud is Head Coach of the Mercury Energy Tactix Netball Team which competes in the ANZ Championship, the semi professional Australasian netball competition involving five New Zealand and five Australian franchise teams. Helen has experienced a number of elite sports environments having represented New Zealand at the Inaugural Women's World Rugby Cup, Canterbury touch, netball and surf life saving. Helen has been a member of the New Zealand Police for 20 years and currently works part time as a Senior Police Constable at the Papanui Police. She is married to Alan Stroud (former All White) and has three children, Ben 12, Georgia 9 and Lucy 7. Helen's passion for sport and competition continues to drive her enthusiasm for performance both on and off the netball court.

## **Chris Keenan**

Manager, Resource Management and Environment, Horticulture NZ

Chris has been managing resource management and environment matters on behalf of Horticulture New Zealand since early 2007. This work programme operates across 68 district and city councils and 11 regional councils. At any one time up to 65 plan interventions are occurring within this portfolio. The work covers a comprehensive range of resource management issues from land use controls, air discharges, agricultural use, contaminated land and zoning matters to water allocation and quality work.

Prior to Horticulture New Zealand Chris was a senior adviser at the Ministry for the Environment working water policy and waste policy. Chris has also held officer positions in enforcement and compliance and environmental research at Wellington and Auckland Regional Council's. He has also worked for local councils and consultancies. He has conjoint qualifications in resource management and science from Lincoln University. Chris is currently involved in 7 central government reform processes; is a member of the small group on the Government's Land and Water Forum, a foundation member of the Primary Sector Water Partnership and has been involved in Phase 2 reforms of the Resource Management Act, Auckland's Governance arrangements and the Canterbury Strategic Water Study.



## Tony Sewell

CEO Ngāi Tahu Property Ltd

Tony has held the role of Chief Executive of Ngāi Tahu Property Limited since its establishment in 1994. Tony has a construction and property background with experience in quantity surveying, project management, property development and investment.

Tony has led Ngāi Tahu Property from an asset base of \$2 million, to become the South Island's strongest property company with an asset base now in excess of \$400 million. The company has a portfolio of property investments in the Crown, big box retail and commercial sectors, a property development portfolio in the residential subdivision and commercial sectors and a rural portfolio of high country stations, land leased to forestry companies and land in the process of change of use from forestry to pastoral. The company has a staff of 21 property professionals specialising in property investment, property management and property development.

In the late 1990's Tony played a major role in negotiating with the Crown for the settlement of the Ngai Tahu Claim with specific responsibility for land matters and the right of first refusal.

Tony's interests outside of the business include rowing, rugby and fishing. Tony is married to Margaret and has three daughters: Rebecca, Rose and Annie (aged 27 to 21).

## Robert Prince

CEO NGI Australia, CNP

Robert is originally from New Zealand and has a Bachelor of Science in Biology and Biochemistry. He worked as the Regional Market Development Manager for Bayer NZ, and then moved on to Yates NZ as Divisional Manager before being appointed Managing Director in 1990. Robert relocated to Sydney in 1994 as General Manager Group Marketing for Yates Australia, then General Manager Technical Business Development. Robert worked in the renewable energy and urban forestry sectors from 2003 to 2006 when he accepted the role as National Environment and Technical Policy Manager with NGIA before taking up the CEO position in October 2007.

## Murray Sherwin

Director General Agriculture

Murray joined MAF as Director-General in November 2001. He came to MAF from the Reserve Bank where he was Deputy Governor and Deputy Chief Executive. He joined the Reserve Bank of New Zealand in 1976, working as an economic analyst. In 1984, Murray was appointed Chief Manager of the Bank's International Department. He subsequently held Chief Manager positions in the Financial Markets Department and the Banking System Department.

During his career with the Reserve Bank, Murray had a number of secondments, including to the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, Paris (1979); the Prime Minister's Advisory Group (1982-1983); and to the World Bank, Washington DC (1987-1989) where he was a member of the Board of Executive Directors. He was appointed Deputy Governor in June 1995.

Marketing and Events Co-ordinator NGI NSW, Yates Garden Retailer of the Year 2010 judge

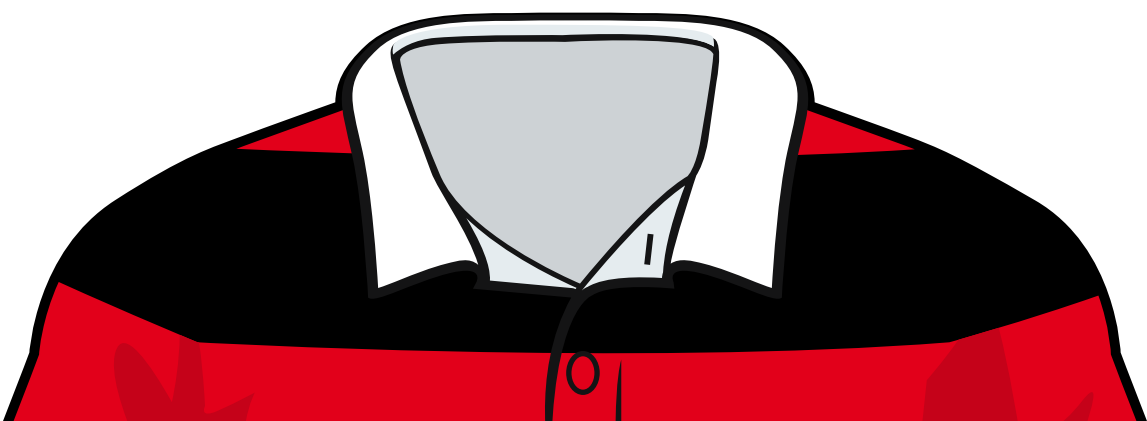
